The Registrar welcomed all the members of the Academic Council and informed the Council that the quorum required for the meeting was satisfactory. The Registrar requested Hon. Vice-Chancellor to start the meeting. Hon. Vice-Chancellor informed all the members of the Academic Council that this meeting has been called mainly for approving the Course Structure and Syllabi for various Courses. All the Chairmen, Board of Studies will present the Course Contents and Syllabi. The meeting was started and following points were discussed and decided.

Item No. 1: To confirm the minutes of the 10th Meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th May 2018

The draft minutes of the 10th Meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th May 2018 were sent to the members of the Academic Council for their comments. Few comments were received. Dr. Ulhas Shiurkar pointed out through mail that old Course Structure has been circulated amongst the AC members. However, on the day of the meeting, he confirmed that revised Course Structure as discussed in the meeting has been received. Dr. S.R. Choudhari asked about certain clarification on the examination related points. The I/c. Controller of Examinations clarified the doubts and the minutes were confirmed.

"Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on 19th May 2018 be and are confirmed with inclusion of some corrections in the draft minutes."

Item No. 2: Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 10th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th May 2018

Item-wise Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 10th Meeting of the Academic Council, held on 19th May 2018 was presented to the Council by the Registrar. The

Council took review on all the actions taken and expressed satisfaction and the action taken item was confirmed.

“Resolved that the Action Taken Report be confirmed.”

Item No. 3: Report of the LIC Review Committee


The Registrar informed the Council that the Committee under the Chairmanship of Dr. M.B.Kumthekar was constituted to review the LIC and Scrutiny Reports for the new institutions. Since Dr. Kumthekar was not present, the Registrar requested Dr. Katti who is the Member-Secretary of the Review Committee to present the report. Dr. Katti presented the report. He informed the Council that from A.Y. 2018-19, the DTE has notified that the conditional affiliation letters should not be issued to any of the institutions. He also informed the Council that out of 32 new institutions, there were three critical cases which were deliberated in the Planning and Evaluation (Monitoring) Board meeting as under for consideration of the Academic Council.

Sr. No. 21. Bharatiya Gramin Punarrachana Sanstha, Aurangabad, Hi-Tech Institute of Technology: The discrepancy pointed out was about the land availability which was not as per the AICTE norms. The Board deliberated on this issue and Resolved that since the Apex Body (AICTE) has extended the letter of approval (EOA) to this institution, the University affiliation be accorded.”

Sr. No. 30. Abhinav Education Society's College of Pharmacy : It was pointed out that the College has applied for affiliation for B.Pharm Existing Course and introduction of the Pharm. D. Course. The LIC & Review Committees observed that adequate infrastructure was not available for Pharm D. programme. The Board discussed the issue.

“Resolved that affiliation for B.Pharm course be considered whereas for Pharm D, affiliation be accorded subject to NOC and permission from Apex Bodies.”

Sr. No. 32. Shri Sai College of Engineering and Technology, Aurangabad : It was pointed out that the college had been de-affiliated by the parent University and the matter is sub-judice. It was also observed that AICTE has accorded EoA to the college for the A.Y. 2018-19. However, considering the history of deaffiliation and the subjudice matter, the college shall not be considered as Centre for Examination and CAP Centre for a period of three years.



"Resolved that the since AICTE has accorded extension of approval for A.Y. 2018-19, the affiliation for the college be considered with the stipulated conditions"

"The Academic Council Resolved that the report of the Review Committee be recommended to Executive Council for further approval." Copy of the report is enclosed herewith as **Annexure-A.**

Admission to failed students of the parent University.

Admission of the failed students of parent University was also discussed. As per the request of affiliating colleges, this point was put up for the consideration of the Council. The Council discussed this issue, considering all the forthcoming issues about the admission process. A report of the Equivalence Committee was presented. Copy of the same is enclosed herewith as **Annexure-B.**


After detailed discussion, Academic Council directed to readmit the students of affiliated colleges those who were registered with their parent University during A.Y.2016-17 under following conditions at Dr. B. A. Tech. University during A.Y. 2018-19

- i) Failed to take readmission at first year during A.Y. 2017-18
- ii) Now cleared their first year and would like to take admission at second year during A.Y. 2018-19
- iii) Those who have year down at their second year and would like take readmission at second year during A.Y. 2018-19

Subjected to producing following documents

- a) The No Objection Certificate and Transfer/Migration certificates for transfer of these candidates from their Parent University.
- b) The CET merit list of such candidates for the AY 2016-17 and NOC from DTE
- c) The copy of CET Admit Card showing the allocation of seat and verified documents for admission purpose. The documents shall have to be uploaded and verified during the Online Registration and Enrolment of the candidates.
- d) The results of last two/four Semesters and the attendance records for these candidates.
- e) Reason(s) for the transfer from the parent University to Dr. B A Technological University.
- f) The equivalence of the subjects will be applicable at different levels.





The Council approve as above and also directed to Equivalence Committee to prepare detail procedure to be followed for each possible scenario for consideration of the Council in the next meeting.

Item No. 4: To approve the Course Structure and Syllabi for the various Courses

Hon. Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that this meeting of the Academic Council is convened mainly for approving the Course Structure and Syllabi for first and second year and Course Structure for third and final year and also for M.Tech Courses.

All the Chairmen, Boards of Studies, were requested to present the Course Structure and detailed Course Contents for respective programmes. The syllabi presented by the Chairmen were discussed at greater length. It was informed by the Controller of Examinations that as per suggestion of Hon. Vice-Chancellor in the last meeting, the Course Contents and Course Code of all the Courses common to more than one programmes have been finalized and is the same. Also the Chairmen have submitted the revised structure of Syllabi considering Common Codes and Common Course Contents. The final Course Structure and Syllabi is enclosed herewith for the approval of the Council as **Annexure-C**.

The Council instructed BoS Chairmen to maintain a uniform Structure of 6 theory papers and 3 to 4 practical sessions with credit distribution of 60:40. Each paper should have six units with emphasis on tutorials for learning by the students.

The Council also directed to divide the Course of Project Management and Intellectual Property Right as separate Courses instead of keeping them tied. These Courses will be kept as Project Management or IPR instead of single course.

"Resolved that considering the suggestions made by the Council during presentation of the respective Chairman, Board of Studies the syllabi of all 2nd year of B. Tech programmes, M.Tech Programmes and diploma programmes and course structure for first to final year B.Tech, First and Second Year M.Tech and Diploma courses be approved."

It was further resolved that for Architecture, the guidelines of Council of Architecture and for Pharmacy, the guidelines of Pharmacy Council of India be adopted."

5.1 To approve Academic Quality Assurance Report 2016-17

The Registrar informed the Council that since Dr. L.N.Singh, IQAC Co-ordinator was not present and the item was differed in the last meeting. Therefore, this item was brought before the Council. Dr. L.N.Singh was requested to present the AQAR for A.Y. 2016-17 before the Council.

Dr. L.N.Singh presented the AQAR. The Council discussed and approved the report for A.Y. 2016-17 submitted by Dr.L.N.Singh. The copy of the report is enclosed herewith as **Annexure-D**.

5.2 To approve the Rules and Regulations for Architecture

Ar. Prashant Deshmukh, Chairman, Board of Studies in Architecture was requested to present the Course Structure, Course contents, Rules and Regulations before the Council. He informed the Council that the Apex Body for the Architecture is Council of Architecture and the Rules and Regulations of the same are applicable for Architectural Faculty. The BoS for the Architecture has prepared the Rules and Regulations on the same lines.

It was discussed that since the Apex Body for the Architecture has prescribed, these rules, the Rules and Regulations be adopted as it is. "Resolved that the Course Structure, Course Contents, Rules and Regulations for Architecture be approved." Resolved further that the Ordinance Committee appointed by the Academic Council shall formulate corresponding Ordinances and Rules and Regulations and put to AC in the next meeting.

5.3 To approve B.Voc Courses, Structure, Rules and Regulations.

Hon. Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that as per the guidelines of AICTE, a three years Degree programme has been initiated under National Skill Qualification Framework with the nomenclature of Bachelor of Vocational Education (B.Voc) from Academic Year 2018-19. The basic eligibility to apply these courses is that only AICTE approved institutions are eligible to apply for these programmes. Following institutes have applied for NoC to start such programmes.


"Resolved that the Course structure of B.Voc courses in following six courses be approved."

5.4 Formation of Various Boards

Hon. Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that there is need for formation of various Boards in Engineering, Pharmacy, Architecture and HMCT faculty. He also appealed to the Council that nominations on these boards be informed to the University preferably by next week. The proposal for formation of different Boards was placed before the Academic Council for streamlining the functioning of the University





particularly of the Regional Centres and Sub-centres, the following Boards have been proposed.

- (i) Faculty
- (ii) Board of University Departments and Institute
- (iii) Regional Boards of the Centres and Sub-Centres.
- (iv) Board of Research and Development
- (v) Board of Post-graduate Education in each faculty.
- (vi) Board of Innovation, Incubation, Entrepreneurship and Linkages
- (vii) Board of Information Technology Services
- (viii) Board of Students Development and Extensional activities.

“Resolved that these Boards as proposed above be formulated.”

5.5 Academic Calendar for A.Y 2018-19

The Controller of Examinations presented the Academic Calendar before the Council. The Council discussed and modified the same. Copy of the Academic Calendar is enclosed herewith as **Annexure-F**.



Item No. 1: To confirm the minutes of the 6th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th August, 2017

The Registrar informed the meeting that the draft minutes of the 6th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th August, 2017 were sent to the members of the Academic Council for their comments via e-mail. The same were tabled for confirmation.



The minutes were confirmed with the following corrections.

Dr. Balasubramaniam, Dr. Bhandari were present for the last meeting. But it was recorded as absent. The correction has been made about their presence.

Item No. 2: Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 6th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th August, 2017

The Registrar presented item-wise Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 6th meeting of the Academic Council held on 19th August, 2017. It was discussed in detail and suggestions given were noted as below.

- (1) Readmission of students: The Council had resolved in its 6th meeting to accommodate the students of affiliated colleges who had failed in the 1st year examinations of the Universities, to which the colleges were affiliated to. Dr. Katti presented the list of the students from individual colleges and other details to the Council. (Annexure-I). The members also expressed concerns on the hardships faced by the college personnel to travel to the University for the readmission. The University shall streamline the procedure with staff at the Regional Centers from next year.

- (2) Considering the possibility of transfer of the students again in the second year in next academic year, the Council has formed the Equivalence Committee. The Committee had met on 17th November 2017. The Council discussed several issues for deciding equivalence at all levels such as Grade calculation, transfer between colleges, transfer of credits between Universities where DBATU shall have twinning arrangement under TEQIP, between state Universities and J&K transfer students. The Committee will submit its report in 31st December 2017 to the council.
- (3) The Council had suggested submission of syllabi of M.Arch courses from colleges who are running the course. The BoS Chairman agreed to provide the details on 23rd November 2017. The non-availability of the course structure is affecting the examination.
- (4) On a query from a member, the BoS Chairman (Architecture) agreed to conduct a meeting with all Architecture faculty in all affiliated colleges for exam related issues.
- (5) Since the digital evaluation training was not appropriately conducted by the Service provider, the council suggested one more round of training at Aurangabad, Solapur and Kolhapur Region.

Item No. 3: Accepting 'SWAYM COURSE' in University Curriculum

A letter from Shri. Prakash Javadekar, Hon. Minister for Human Resource Development, directing the University to follow up National Convention on Digital Initiatives and to approve the courses from competent Authority was put to discussion and approval.

The Council resolved to accept the proposal of recognizing the courses offered by the SWAYAM platform provided by the Ministry of Human Resources Development. The colleges can adopt the courses for the programs under affiliation with the University. The Council further approved the credit recognition and transfer obtained by the students with SWAYAM platform. The colleges will have choice to select upto 20% of their courses under SWAYAM and will follow the rules of the University. The UG and PG Program Committees shall frame relevant rules if necessary for the credit earning and transfer. Letter is attached herewith as **Annexure II**.

Item No. 4: AQAR (15-16) Annual Quality Assurance Report

As per NAAC guidelines for accredited institutions, a progress report on tangible results achieved in key areas has been prepared for A.Y. 2015-16. The AQAR was tabled for the consideration of the Council.

The Council asked for the report for A.Y. 2016-17. The Director, IQAC agreed to provide the same in the 2nd Week of December 2017. The minutes of the IQAC meeting shall be also circulated by the Director to all Council members by 31st December 2017

Council further resolved to expand the IQAC team by taking one nomination each from each Regional Centre and Sub center. The nominations shall be obtained from colleges having NAAC accreditation and the person must be IQAC Director of the college. The IQAC Director shall issue the letters after getting names from each Regional Centre and Sub-center.

One member of the Council expressed the view of the teachers from his colleges that incorporation of project in first year syllabus for continuous assessment has been making change in the learning of the students which was a welcome observation.

Item No. 5: M. Tech. 45% passing in Semester Examination

- (1) The Controller of examination presented that as per the First Rules of the University, minimum 45% of the total marks has be secured in total which should be brought in line to the passing grade rule for the UG courses.

Rules and Regulations Chapter R3.2, (should be added as an amendment to the existing rules)

- (a) The candidates who obtain 45% and more marks in a subject head of the end semester examination AND 45% or more of the total marks of a subject head shall be deemed to have **passed** the respective subject head.
- (b) The candidates who obtain less than 45% of marks in a subject head of the end semester examination and less than 45% the total marks of a subject head shall be deemed to have **failed** in the respective subject head (**Grade FF**).

The Rule shall be effective from AY 2017-18 and applicable to the students admitted in the University departments, and Affiliated Colleges from AY 2017-18.

- (2) The Council discussed the quality of M Tech Dissertation considering that such reports are also fabricated and advertised. The Council decided to develop a framework for evaluation of the thesis.
The following Committee under the Chairmanship of Dr. Joshi, SGGs, has been entrusted with the responsibility of developing suitable framework for assessment of dissertation.

Item No. 6: Discrepancies in Ordinances Rules and Regulations

The Controller of Examination brought to attention of the members several discrepancies found in the Rules and Regulations and Ordinances related with Examination. The copy is attached herewith as **Annexure III**

The Council also discussed the differences in syllabi with respect to the number of credits, standardization of code and number of hours. The UG and PG Program Committees will reconcile all the differences before 31st Dec 2017 by using IT tools.

The Council also asked to include concerns of all affiliated colleges while reconciling the data. The concerned BoS Chairmen will have to take care of issues on immediate basis. If necessary, the BoS Chairmen shall invite faculty members from affiliated colleges for assistance.

Item No.7: Any other point/s with the permission of the Chair

1. Dr. Sadaiah, BoS Chairman, (Mechanical Engg) presented a proposal for inclusion of Finite Element Method (FEM) as an elective subject for M.Tech. course. The FEM course was recommended by BoS for both the M.Tech. Programmes i.e. Manufacturing Engineering and Thermal and Fluids Engineering. It is approved as an elective course for an M.Tech. (FEM). The Council also suggested that the PG Program Committee shall try to reconcile the program to bring down the papers for examination March 15, 2017.


2. Change in the subject name

BoS Chairman (Mechanical Engineering) presented a correction in M.Tech. (Thermal and Heat Power Engineering) syllabus. The subject MTHIE 1e/2e Design of Heat Exchanger needs to be corrected as under MTHIE 1e/2e Design of Heat Exchange Equipment. The Council approved the correction.

3. Minutes of Research Committee of Chemical Engineering

The minutes of Research Committee held on 12th October, 2017 for Chemical Engineering were by the BoS Chairman. The Council approved the minutes which are attached herewith as **Annexure IV**

The Council was presented case of two candidates who had registered for Ph.D program. The candidates have requested for cancellation of their registration. The council approved the same.



4. Dr. Balasubramaniam, Chairman, Committee for Research Activities, informed about the Council about the Brain Storming session conducted by him as per the Council resolution in 6th AC Meeting for improvement of the research activities in the University Departments. He further informed that one more session is required and separate exercise will be conducted for teachers of the affiliated colleges. The Committee shall submit the report once the second session is over. The TEQIP programs should be also brought under the Committee's consideration.

5. The Registrar presented the revised fees for the PhD program. As per the State Govt. rules 10% increase is permissible. The Council approved the proposal of Ph.D. Fees as Rs. 72,394/-.

6. The letter from Principal, Dhamangaon College of Engineering, Nagpur, regarding the change in passing head during the academic year, was noted. The Council was informed that only one college had raised this point.

7. The Council was informed that Technical team was not available for training the teachers at Aurangabad, Solapur and Kolhapur. A second round of training was suggested for these colleges using appropriate manpower.

8. The issues of the conduct of the examination will be discussed by the Board of Examination on 22nd November 2017. It was proposed that the practical Examination be conducted after the theory examination.


9. It was brought to notice of the council that

(a) For the M Tech in Water Resource Management, the Subjects and Subject Information was not submitted by the college data in time. Because of which students cannot fill their exam forms and teachers cannot upload their Mid Semester Marks in the UMIS. The data is now ready and will be submitted by Dr. Pore to CoE on 18th November 2017.

(b) The diploma Institute's Students have not filled their Exam Forms. Without their registrations in the system, it is not possible to issue Grade Cards. They will be available only through their email ID.

The Council suggested that the students need to get familiarized with using the system and get their own login ID & password. Principal, loPE will have to complete the process

(c) 5% students are yet to fill their Forms (Excluding 3% of Diploma Students) at the University Departments. DBATU University students' data is not matching with the actual intake. The Student Section of the University will have to take remedial action immediately.



(d) All other Colleges Enrolment data and Form Filling Data has been matched.

(e) All B Tech & M Tech colleges have been informed to fill their Mid Semester Marks.

(f) Sanjeevan Engineering & Technology Institute, Kolhapur (code 6315) have conducted through DTE their admissions for Mechanical Engg. However, they are teaching " Mechanical Engineering Design " for their M Tech branch. Dr. Sadaiah / CoE will do necessary correction as per the AICTE/Affiliation approval papers in the UMIS system. The college shall make necessary correspondence with DTE to get records corrected. A of CoE, Dr. Sadaiah, and Ramdas shall be held on 21st November to settle the issue.





Item No. 1: To confirm the minutes of the 7th and 8th meetings of the Academic Council held on 18th November, 2017 and 12th January, 2018 respectively

The draft minutes of the 7th meeting held on 18th November, 2017 and 8th meeting held on 12th January, 2018 were sent to the members of the Academic Council for their comments. There is a small correction in the minutes. Prof Y.V. Joshi brought to the notice that a committee of Academic Council members has been constituted for developing suitable framework for assessment of dissertation. Dr. Ulhas Shinde is the Executive Council Member and his name has been wrongly entered in the minutes. The name has been replaced by Dr. Ulhas Shiurkar who is the Academic Council member.

With these modification, the minutes of the 7th meeting has been confirmed. There was no any suggestion for the minutes of the 8th meeting of the Academic Council. Resolved that the minutes of the 7th and 8th meetings be confirmed.


 

Item No. 2: Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 7th and 8th meetings of the Academic Council held on 18th November, 2017 and 12th January, 2018 respectively

Item-wise Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 7th and 8th meeting of the Academic Council held on 18th November, 2017 and 12th January, 2018 was tabled before the Academic Council. The Registrar took the review of the same on following points.

1. Regarding implementation of Swayam Course in the University and its affiliated colleges, Dr. Sadaiah, Co-ordinator PG programme and Dr. A.W.Kiwlekar, Co-ordinator UG programme will prepare a draft copy of the relevant rules to be adopted for Swayam Course and will submit it by 31st March 2018 for the consideration of the Council. The Academic Council also resolved that these Swayam Courses will be applicable for PG and UG from Academic Year 2018-19.
2. Regarding AQAR of the University for 16-17, Hon. Vice-Chancellor directed Dr. L.N.Singh, Director IQAC to conduct a meeting of IQAC on urgent basis. He was also directed to co-opt the other Academic Council members from Regional and Sub-regional centres. The Committee IQAC shall submit the report on or before 31st March 2018. Dr. L.N.Singh, informed the Academic Council, that the IQAC meeting would be conducted on 17th February 2018.
3. The Academic Council in its meeting held on 18th November 2018 passed a resolution as under : The candidate who obtain less than 40% of marks in a subject head of the End Semester Examination and less than 40% the total marks of a Subject Head shall be deemed to have failed in the respective subject head (Grade FF). While implementing this rule, a technical difficulty has been raised that this proposal needs to be passed through the Executive Council also. Unfortunately, this proposal had not been processed through the Executive Council and could not be implemented for this academic year. The combined passing will be continued for this academic year. From next Academic Year i.e. 2018-19 these rules be adopted for all including three years of the current batch.
4. Under the Chairmanship of Dr. Y.V.Joshi a Committee has been constituted to develop suitable framework for assessment of dissertation M.Tech programme. He informed that the proposed NBA proforma has been emailed to all the members for any suggestion/modification. Hon. Vice-Chancellor directed that a meeting of all the members be conducted as per convenience of all the members. TA/DA will be provided to these members as per University Rules. The Committee is directed to submit its report on or before 28th February 2018.





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5. Regarding discrepancies in Ordinances, Rules and Regulations, Hon. Vice-Chancellor directed Dr. Sadaiah and Dr. Kiwlekar to reconcile and submit a report on or before 10th February. He also directed Prof. Y.N.Patil to co-ordinate this activity and submit the report before 28th February 2018.

With the above modifications and comments on action taken, the item has been finalized.


Item No. 3: To appoint Deans and Associate Deans

Hon. Vice-Chancellor briefed the members of the Academic Council about the appointment of Deans and Associate Deans. These positions for Deans and Associate Deans have not been sanctioned by the Government for the University and it is quite difficult to appoint these positions on regular basis. The University cannot effectively function without the Deans and Associate Deans. Hence, it is proposed that additional Charge be given to interested faculty members with necessary qualifications and experience as prescribed in the first Statutes.

The Academic Council discussed this matter. It was informed that for the position of Dean, applications from regular University faculty members have been invited. It is proposed to invite the applications from the interested faculty members of the affiliated colleges at the Regional and Sub-regional Centres. Two Executive Council members and two Academic Council members will talk to persons who are interested to take additional charge as Dean or Associate Dean and who can contribute to the University from each Regional Centre by conducting proper meetings. A Committee of the following Academic Council members is constituted.

Two additional members will be added to the Committee from Executive Council on 3rd February. The Academic Council approved the above proposal.



Item No. 4: To brief the Affiliation Progress for A.Y. 2018-19

Dr. P.K.Katti presented the item to the Academic Council. He informed the Council that for A.Y. 2018-19, the affiliation portal was open from Aug - Oct 31, 2017 for new and existing professional institutes.

Over all 43 colleges have applied for affiliation includes Engineering & Technology, Pharmacy & Architecture. Out of which 2 colleges withdrawn and 2 colleges postponed the process to next academic year. The breakup of the remaining 39 colleges is as under :

Engineering and Technology	: 21
Pharmacy	: 17
Architecture	: 01

The information of new and existing colleges has been submitted to Government of Maharashtra and Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai by 31st December 2017. (The list is enclosed herewith as **(Annexure - I)**) The process of affiliation is in progress and is expected to complete by March /April 2018. Dr. Katti also informed the Council that number of colleges affiliated to the University exceeded 100. The exact tally is 102. The number of students for the academic year 2018-19 is expected to cross 35000 plus.

On a proposal from a member to include names of faculty members from affiliated colleges on the Local Inspection Committee (LIC), the Chairman asked the members to put such proposals with adequate information in a proper format for inclusion in the panel of the University.

Item No. 5: To take review of Winter Examinations 2017

Prof. Y.N.Patil, I/c. Controller of Examinations briefed the Academic Council the exact status of the results. He informed the Council that the First Winter Examinations all over the State have been conducted smoothly and successfully. The results of 2nd 3rd and final year examinations have been declared within 45 days.

The results of Winter Examinations of first year will be declared by 10th February 2018 i.e. from 45 days of completion of examinations. The Council noted the same.

At the same time, Hon. Vice-Chancellor informed the Council about the resignation of Prof. Y.N.Patil, I/c. Controller of Examinations. He briefed the Council that Prof. Patil has taken admission for Ph.D.programme in Computer Engineering in the University and it would not be proper to hold the post of Controller of Examinations. For last more than



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10 years, he has served the University Examination Section as Assistant CoE and Controller of Examinations. The services rendered by Prof. Patil has been appreciated by Hon. Vice-Chancellor.

The Council noted the work carried out by Prof. Patil for more than 10 years and appreciated.

Item No. 6: Proposal for No Remedial Exam for P.G. Courses

The University has initiated on-line Remedial Examination from Academic Year 2017-18 for UG courses. However, there is no provision made for Remedial Examination for PG course. The Council resolved to not to have on-line Remedial Examination for PG courses. Supplementary Examination, however, will be conducted. Prof.Y.N.Patil, I/c. Controller of Examination presented the point to the Academic Council. He briefed about the present rules and proposed rules as under:

As per 14.2 PG Rules and Regulations for M.Tech:

2. A student can appear for re-examinations in the subject(s) concerned in which he/she gets "FF" grade. The re-examinations pertaining to both even and odd semesters will be conducted as per the schedule notified in the academic calendar. In re-examination the student will be given one grade lower than the actual performance grade except in the case of Grade "E" which will remain unchanged. The student will apply in a prescribed form together with necessary fees in order to appear in the re-examinations.


3. Students with "FF" grades also have an option to re-register for the subject (s) in which they had failed, in the following Autumn Semester or Spring semester. In such a case they will be entitled to full credit according to performance at the examination.

Should be changed to :

A student can appear for supplementary examinations in the subject(s) concerned in which he/she gets "FF" grade. The supplementary examinations pertaining to both even and odd semesters will be conducted as per the schedule notified in the academic calendar.

The student will apply in a prescribed form together with necessary fees in order to appear in the re-examinations.

Supplementary End-Semester Examination



(1) For those candidates who fail in a subject head or are eligible for appearing at the repeat examination, A Supplementary End-Semester Examination of odd semester will be conducted before the regular End semester examination of the even semester.

(2) A Supplementary End-Semester Examination of even semester will be conducted before the regular End semester examination of the odd semester.

(3) The marks obtained by candidates in the in-semester examinations (continuous assessment and mid-term examination) will be carried forward in such cases.

(4) Grading the performance in the Supplementary Examination: The grades will be assigned as per existing rules and regulations without reducing the grade.

(5) Revaluation of end-semester and Supplementary examination:

Candidate's performance in these examinations will be announced on web portal of the University and after one month of such announcement the Grade Statements will be sent to the concerned Department for distribution to the students. Those who want to get the photocopy of their answer books are required to pay the requisite fee. Revaluation of these examinations shall be allowed. Those students who would like to have the revaluation of their answer books are required to pay a requisite fee.

After detailed discussion, the Academic Council approved the proposal.

Item No. 6: To brief about Perspective Plan status & Government Decision

The Perspective Plan was discussed in 2nd meeting of Planning and Evaluation (Monitoring) Board, 3rd Academic Council meeting, 3rd Executive Council meeting. The copy of which was sent to the Government of Maharashtra for further considerations. Government instructed to revise the Perspective Plan as per Narendra Jadhav Committee's recommendations. The Perspective Plan was modified accordingly. The final soft copy of the Perspective Plan was sent to the Academic Council members.

Hon. Vice-Chancellor briefed the Academic Council members about the Perspective Plan of the University and he also informed the Council that the Perspective Plan of the University is accepted by the Government and for next Academic Year and the Government has recommended to AICTE not to give approval to any new engineering colleges in the state for the Academic Year 2018-19.

The Academic Council ratified the Final revised Perspective Plan of the University which was sent to Government and all the members. "Resolved that the Perspective Plan be approved."

Item No. 7: M.Tech. Rules and Regulations

Presently, the first Rules and Regulation of DBATU are being used (R 3.2 page 48 to 56). These rules are displayed on the University website of the University (www.dbatu.ac.in). Hon. Vice-Chancellor briefed the council about the existing M.Tech Rules and Regulations. The Academic Council discussed the issue. Hon. Vice-Chancellor requested the committee headed by Prof. Y.V.Joshi to look into the existing rules and regulations for M.Tech. If necessary, the committee may suggest changes or modify the same.

Prof. Y.V.Joshi and the Academic Council agreed for the same.

Item No. 8: Regarding MoU with Industry for Training Program

Professor P K Katti briefed about the MOU signed with CEAT Limited, a flagship company which showed interest through a letter of intent for imparting technical skills training to their employees on 5th June 2017. After few meetings with the company authorities, the MOU has been signed on 19-01-2018 to impart technical skill training to the employees of CEAT Ltd. The training program will be conducted at the premises of Industry from Thursday- Sunday every week.

He also proposed to accord approval for the mutually agreed contents of training module and Certification of nomenclature as specified in MOU i.e. "Certificate Course in Basic Engineering & Automation" under the Seal of University. The University will spare the identified faculty to work as resource persons for the said period as stated in the MOU. (The copy of the MOU is enclosed herewith as **(Annexure - II)**)

The efforts to impart training was appreciated by members of the Committee and "Resolved that the proposal be approved as per MOU conditions."

Item No. 9: To brief the point from Affiliation Section

1. Proposal to open Online Affiliation Portal

Dr. P.K.Katti, proposed to approve for the online affiliation system activation for new and existing institutes, who have not submitted their proposals before 31st October and are interested in affiliation to the University for the academic year 2018-19. The matter was put up for discussion and approval.

The matter was discussed in greater detail. Few members raised various points and reservation on opening of affiliation portal at this stage. The Academic Council "resolved that the online portal should not be opened looking into various future consequences. The present practice be continued as per the Act.

2. Amendment to Affiliation Manual

Looking into upgradation of the online system, certain amendments were proposed by Dr. P. K. Katti in the affiliation manual to be incorporated in the online Affiliation process was tabled. Two amendments were proposed to the Affiliation manual to be incorporated from A.Y.2018-19.

The Committee after discussion and deliberations, resolved to approve necessary amendments to be incorporated as per Table No. 3(d) & 4(a) (copy is enclosed herewith as **(Annexure -III)** for new affiliation from Academic Year 2019-20 .

3.To appoint a fact finding Committee for Mahatma Basweshwar Education Society College of Engineering.

Looking in to the management conflict & difficulties faced in administration of the two colleges of Mahatma Basweshwar Education Society's Colleges affiliated to this University, it is proposed to appoint a fact finding Committee to investigate the factual situation at these colleges. The colleges are:

2. College of Engineering Ambajogi



75 (1) No person shall be appointed as the Principal of an affiliated college or an institution maintained by the University except on the recommendation of a selection committee constituted for the purpose consisting of -



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- (a) the Vice-Chancellor, ex-officio Chairman and
- (b) three persons having special knowledge of the subject or subjects in which instruction is being provided by the college or institution, of whom two shall be nominated by the Executive Council and one by the Academic Council, being persons not in the service of the University.

(2) The procedure for selection and appointment of such principal shall be prescribed by section 68.

The matter was discussed in greater detail. Hon. Vice-Chancellor informed the council that he may not be able to Chair every time for every college. He will nominate a person as per the procedure. The Academic Council resolved that whenever difficulty arises for presence of the VC in the selection on principal for a college, he shall nominate the Chairman of the Committee.

The Committee is expected to submit the report before 28th February 2018.






Item No. 1: To conduct of Final Year and Backlog Examinations

After lot of deliberations and discussions Academic Council finalized the format of the examination as well as format of the question paper for the Final Year (2019-20 Batch) Regular Examinations.

It is decided that, form of examination will be open-book and it is of 50 marks. The detailed Question Paper Format for Examination is as follows:

Question Paper comprising of 2 Marks, 5 Marks and 10 Marks Questions of descriptive types and duration of the examinations will be 90 minutes. Additional 90 minutes will be given to download the question paper, Scanning and uploading the answer-sheets. In case of internet related issues student can be given additional 30 minutes to communicate with Grievance Cell and resolve the issue.

The number of questions and marks will be as per following table:



Syllabus for examination will be first 2.5 units of the course content of each subject. The question bank will be mailed to all the students on 7th September and will also be uploaded on University website.

It is also decided to conduct two mock examinations on 15th and 20th of September, 2020 to see the difficulties in the process and make the student aware about new pattern of examination.

To address the all kind of grievances of the students related to this examination, AC asked to constitute **Terminal Examination Grievances Cell** consisting of Heads of University Departments and two Principals of affiliated colleges from each region.

Resolution: AC resolved that the examination will be an Open-book and all questions will be descriptive type. The exam will be conducted for 50 Marks and marks obtained will be extrapolated to 60. If at all backlog exam is to be conducted, it will processed in the same manner.

3. Prof (Mrs) S. S. Metkar presented the syllabus and course structure for Petrochemical Engineering and as there was no significant changes over the previous BoS meeting (19/6/2020), the members suggested that now the syllabus and course structure should be sent to AC approval (if needed) in its present form.
4. Prof Sadanand Guhe and Prof. Unmesh Patil suggested some corrections in the syllabus. There are some cases of migration to final year of engineering programs from the affiliated colleges. For migration of students from other Universities to DBATU, we need to have equivalence at final year level with each of these Universities.

Since our University has few subjects at final year level compared to other Universities. We need to see the overall subjects previously passed, in respect of BATU curriculum, by the students migrating from other University before awarding the degree.

Resolution: After discussions and deliberations, AC directed University to form committee to decide equivalence for admitting students to final year migrating from other Universities to DBATU. In case of some students who have completed the span of 8 years admitted before 2016 and a span of 6 years admitted in 2016 and onward, AC directed to give additional span of two years to complete program.

ITEM No.2: Formation of BoS for Bachelor of Food Technology and Bachelor of Hotel Management and Catering Technology

A. BoS for Bachelor of Food Technology

The Ballarpur Institute of Technology, Ballarpur under our University has requested for development of the curriculum for the Food Technology programme. There was a need to develop a curriculum for this program urgently.

Since meeting of AC was not scheduled and it was necessary to form Adhoc BoS for the Food Technology Programme, Dean (Academics-FoET) recommended the list of names for constitution of Adhoc BoS to the Hon. Vice-Chancellor.
